ETITO'S EXTERNAL MODERATION TEAM IS NOW LOOKING FOR ANOTHER TALENTED INDIVIDUAL FROM THE SECURITY INDUSTRY WITH SPECIALISED SKILLS AND EXPERTISE [SECURITY STAFF SERVICES] TO JOIN US.

Moderation is an integral part of ETITO's broader quality assurance system. Our moderation process is designed to ensure that assessments against our unit standards are fair, valid, consistent and meet industry and New Zealand Qualifications Authority [NZQA] standards.

As the recognised standards setting body for our industries, ETITO is required by NZQA to moderate assessments registered by accredited training providers against our unit standards on the National Qualifications Framework [NQF]. To do this we operate a centrally established and directed national moderation system which meets moderation best practice principles.

External Moderation

ETITO National Moderators apply best practice moderation principles to assessments completed and registered with NZQA by accredited training providers, other standard setting bodies, and some internally provided assessment by ETITO work place assessors, during our moderation timeframe of January to December.

External Moderator role

Reporting to the Moderation Manager you will work alongside the other External Moderators to provide moderation services in the security industry, including:

- Moderating a sample of assessment material [a percentage of which may require site visits] as directed by the Moderation Manager.
- Completing a brief moderation report for each moderation activity and a very brief summary report at year end outlining key findings.
- Attending two annual moderation panel meetings.

To join us, you'll need broad experience in the security industry [a minimum of 5 years] and a relevant qualification or be able to provide evidence of skills/knowledge that demonstrate your ability to moderate to Level 4 national certificate level. We also require that you have achieved Unit Standard 4098 – demonstrating understanding of the assessment.

In return for your two year commitment, ETITO will provide full training in moderation and Unit Standard 11551 – moderate assessment and ongoing support and guidance.

Your application will be presented to Security Industry Training Advisory Board members for their consideration and may be presented to other industry members. Applicants will also be measured against the ETITO criteria above. You'll then be notified of your success by the ETITO Moderation Manager.
