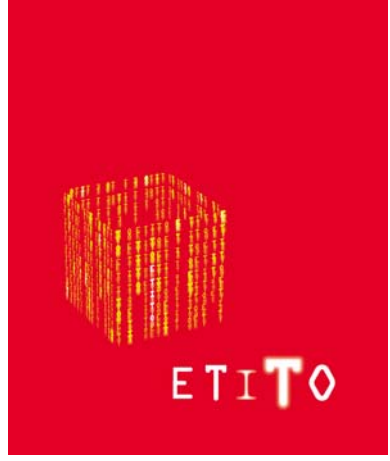


Award winning electronic security apprentice set to go bush!
